Assist. Prof. Dr. Serpil DUNDAR (b. 23 January-1958 - d. 15 October 2016)



Asst. Prof. Dr. Serpil DÜNDAR (23 January 1958-15 October 2016). Serpil Dündar borned in Istanbul on January 23, 1958, and completed her primary, secondary and high school education in Istanbul. She graduated from Ege University, Journalism and Public Relations High School, Radio-TV Department in 1980.

She received his master's degree from Marmara University Institute of Fine Arts in 1997 and his Ph.D. in Social Sciences Institute of Istanbul University in 2003.

Between 1991 and 2014, Dündar worked as a producerdirector at the Anadolu University Open Education Faculty Television Production Center and produced a number of television training programs for the students of the Open Education Faculty.

In the 2nd International Open and Distance Education Symposium organized by the Open Education Faculty in 2006, Dündar's "Language and Concept Development in Children" program was presented as a sample educational program.

She has also produced numerous cultural and arts programs for TVA affiliated to Anadolu University, a local TV broadcast. She served as a lecturer at Anadolu University Open Education Faculty Non-Formal Education Department until his death in October of 2016. Dündar, who conducts research in distance education, media and women's fields, has articles and notifications in these fields.
